A horse ambulance will be in attendance on the Showground during the Show.

SHOWING REGULATIONS

- 1. Exhibitor** - You will need to provide the Ashby de la Zouch & District Agricultural Society with certain personal information relating to you. Your privacy is extremely important to us. We process and hold your personal data as it is necessary to facilitate your entry to the Show. We will not share your data with third parties, except for relevant Government bodies, Breed Societies and/or affiliated Societies and Equine Events, to whom we submit entries and results, to be checked for validity and eligibility based on their legitimate interests. The booking of your class entry to this show will show you agree to this notice.
- 2. Ownership** – All classes in this schedule are open to exhibitors residing on any part of the United Kingdom. Exhibits in all classes must be of bona-fide property of the exhibitor and must be in their ownership at the date of the Show. The exhibitor's name(s) on the Show entry form must be the same as on the animal registration certificate. In the event of the death of an exhibitor between the date of entry and the date of the Show, the executors of the deceased will be deemed to be the exhibitor.
- 3. Entries** – ENTRIES FOR ALL CLASSES - £15 (unless otherwise stated) LIHS Classes are £30 (£11 to LIHS). ALL entries must be made on-line. All entries and fees must be received by the closing date for entries. The entry fee for any animal entered but not exhibited will be forfeited (except as provided for under British Showjumping Rules). Unaccompanied competitors must provide the Show Organiser with a contact telephone number in case of emergency. An additional Administration Charge of £25 will be made in the event of unpaid entries. The official entry closing date is 30th June 2026 and any entry RECEIVED after this date will be considered late. **LATE ENTRIES** may be accepted but a late entry fee of £10 will be added to the entry fee.
- 4. Nomination of Entries** -The name of the exhibit and all relevant details must be stated on the entry form, except in the case of Showjumping and Side-Saddle classes. **No substitution of entries will be allowed after the closing date for entries.**
- 5. Cancellation of Classes** – The Society reserves the right to amalgamate or cancel classes of sections in the event of there being insufficient entries. Entry fees for classes cancelled by the Society will be refunded.
- 6. Admission** – **No tickets or passes will be issued to horse exhibitors.** Please print out your confirmation email of your booking and display in the front of your vehicle to allow admittance into the horse lorry park, using the **RED ENTRANCE**. (Follow the **RED HORSE SIGNS**). A relevant number of wrist bands will be allocated for you to pick up with your back numbers, for admittance to the main show ground. Vehicles other than ones carrying horses must park in the public parking areas and anyone not holding passes will be charged normal prices at the gate. **NO CARS WILL BE ALLOWED TO PARK IN THE HORSE BOX FIELD.**

Extra persons will be expected to pay for admission and Stewards may inspect vehicles. **All exhibitors should be on the Show ground at least half an hour before the stated judging time for their respective classes. EXHIBITORS ARE RECOMMENDED TO ARRIVE EARLIER TO AVOID TRAFFIC CONGESTION AT THE ENTRANCE GATES.** EXHIBITORS SHOULD ENSURE THAT THEY BRING ALL THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTATION TO THE SHOW, AS REQUIRED BY MINISTRY REGULATIONS. FAILURE TO DO SO MAY RESULT IN ANIMALS BEING REFUSED ADMISSION TO THE SHOW GROUND.

- 7. Veterinary** – The Society's veterinary surgeons are authorised to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to the Show ground suspected of being infected with a contagious or infectious disease, or with a disease or injury which, in their opinion renders it unfit or unsafe to be exhibited. Such an animal will not be allowed to compete. The exhibitor will be held entirely responsible by the Society for any circumstances which may result from the appearance of such an animal on the

Show ground. The Society reserves the right to take blood samples from any animal which the Judge and/or Stewards suspect may have been dosed with illegal substances. A horse ambulance will be in attendance.

- 8. Equine Influenza** – Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21-92 days later), followed by the first booster (150-215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose. Horses must have been vaccinated within 12 months before the Show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the Show. In-foal mares that have already had vaccinations for primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born. Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course. PLEASE NOTE THAT NEITHER VACCINATION CERTIFICATIONS NOR PASSPORTS SHOULD BE SENT TO THE SHOW OFFICE PRIOR TO THE EVENT. HOWEVER, CHECKS WILL BE CARRIED OUT ON THE SHOWGROUND DURING THE SHOW. It is strongly recommended that all horses and ponies should be vaccinated against Equine Influenza. The Society's Veterinary Surgeons will inspect the horse lines. Stewards, at the direction of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons, are empowered to request any horse or pony showing clinical signs of equine influenza to be immediately removed from the Showground. In the event of a serious outbreak the Society reserves the right to require vaccination certificates to be produced.
- 9. Identification** – Exhibits shall be identified in the Judging Rings solely by the numbers issued by the Secretary, corresponding to the catalogue entry for the exhibit.
- 10. Judging** – The Society reserves the right to appoint a substitute should any judge be prevented from attending the Show and all entries are accepted on this understanding. Time of judging, as stated in this Schedule, will be adhered to as strictly as possible but are subject to alteration. Exhibitors must be ready to enter the ring when called upon by the Stewards. A public address system will be used to advise horse and pony competitors to be ready, but it is SOLELY THE COMPETITORS RESPONSIBILITY to be in the ring in time for their class. The Judges and Stewards have discretion to withhold or vary the first and any other prizes should the quality of the entry or entries not merit such a prize.
- 11. Horse Height** – Where the height of the horse or pony is specified in any class, the Judge or Steward may require such animals entered in the class to be measured, unless the animal has an official measurement certificate, issued by the Joint Measurement Scheme. Half an inch will be allowed for normal shoes.
- 12. Age** – The date of birth should be stated on the entry form for foals. The year of birth only need be stated for horses and ponies. All winners of children's classes will be expected to produce birth certificates, if necessary. Riders aged 18 years and under on the day of the Show, must state their date of birth on the entry form.
- 13. Safety** – Anyone RIDING a horse or pony anywhere on the Showground, or LEADING a horse or pony on the Horse Walk, in the Collecting Rings or in the Show Rings, must be wearing a hat, approved by the governing body of the associations under whom they are exhibiting, if so required by that governing body or association. All competitors in the jumping phase of the Working Hunter classes must wear correctly secured Skull Caps / Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards: ALL PAS015:2011, VG1 01.040 2014-12, EN 1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards. Hats which bear EN1384 or BSEN1384 ALONG WITH another accepted standard will be permitted. For example, BSEN1384, PAS015 (1998 or 2011) along with the Kitemark or Inspec IC mark will be acceptable, but not BSEN1384 on its own. All riders in BSPS classes are required to adhere to rule 43 in the 2026 BSPS Rule Book with regard to hat specifications and tagging. The attention of all exhibitors is drawn to the Society's Policy, a copy of which may be seen at the Secretary's cabin. All animals must be secured by halter or other means, except as required at the time of judging. Unruly and fractious animals may be refused admission to the judging rings by the Stewards. Exercising of horses and ponies will only be allowed in the designated exercise areas.
- 14. Conduct** - The Society may at any time, before or during the Show, reject any entry, whether the same has been accepted or not, without giving reasons and their decision shall be final. The Society also has the power to eject from the Show ground any commercial photographers, or persons whose behaviour they consider to be objectionable. Any competitor deemed to be **Rude** or **Aggressive** towards Judges, stewards or volunteers of the Ashby Show Society will be asked to leave the show ground. All dogs on the Show ground must be always kept on leads.
- 15. Dress** - Exhibitors of horses and ponies, grooms and attendants must wear correct dress, as approved by the governing body under whose rules they are exhibiting.
- 16. Objections** - Any exhibitor wishing to lodge an objection must do so in writing and must deliver it to the Secretary within an hour of the Judge's decision being given. Such objections must be accompanied by a deposit of £10 and will be considered by the Society, and their decision shall be final. The deposit will be returned if the objection is sustained. Any complaints should be passed to the Chief Horse Steward to deal with.

- 17. Prize Money - 1st £20. 2nd £15. 3rd £10.** - Following the judge's decision in each class and special award, winning exhibitors will be handed vouchers for their prize money. Prize money will be paid by transfer after the show. Please note that all prize money cards not handed in to the Treasurer on the day will be forfeited. Payable to the following placings dependent on **CATALOGUED** entries –

- 18. Trophies** – Any trophies taken away by the winners must be signed for. The winners agree to have them insured, engraved and returned prior to next year's show. Trophies will be available for photographs at the Horse Secretary's marquee, after all judging has finished, if you prefer to leave them at the Show.
- 19. Missed Class - IT IS THE COMPETITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARRIVE AT THE START OF THEIR CLASSES ON TIME. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN IF CLASSES ARE MISSED.**
- 20. Responsibility** - The Society, its Officers and Staff, disclaim any responsibility and all liability in respect of any accident, damage, injury, disease or loss, howsoever caused, that may occur to any exhibitor or his servant, or the public, or to any animal, article, vehicle or property brought on to the Show ground, or while entering or leaving the Show ground. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by or arising from any animal, article, vehicle or property, exhibited or brought on to the Show ground by them. They shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of, or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned.
- 21. Other Regulations** - Any person, competing or exhibiting an animal in a class covered by a breed society, shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of that breed society and be subject to its constitution and rules (including any disciplinary procedures) insofar as they are applicable to the Show. This Schedule is issued subject to the orders (if any) of DEFRA and local authorities, which may be applicable at the date of the Show.
- 22. Interpretation** - Anything not provided for in the foregoing shall be decided by the Society, whose decision shall be final and binding. On the day of the Show, the Chairman shall have all the powers of the Society under these regulations.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Frank Hewitt Hunter Champion of Champions Cup. The Champion & Reserve Champion from the Ridden Hunter and Ridden Working Hunter are all eligible to compete for this Championship.

The Rotherwood Supreme In-Hand Trophy. The Champion & Reserve Champion from the M & M In-Hand, Welsh Section A & B, Shetland (Overall), Pony Breeding and highest placed In-hand Coloured 15h or under are all eligible for this Championship.

Supreme Ridden Pony Championship. The Champion & Reserve Champion from the M&M Ridden, Mini M&M, Open Show Hunter Pony, Mini Show Hunter Pony, Local Rider, WHP & Mini WHP are all eligible for this Championship.

QUALIFIERS

Q1. This Show is a qualifier for the **NCPA Pony of the Year Show** at Warren Farm Equestrian Centre, Formby, L37 0AN, in September 13th 2026. 1st and 2nd prize winners in appropriate classes will qualify.

Q2. NPS/ NIPNA Dales Pony Stud M&M Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championships. A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an **NPS Qualifying or Life** member in the M&M Ridden section (excluding Leading Rein, First Ridden & WHP). Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification. A pony can only attend one M&M Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship final in a season either at NPS Summer Championships at Malvern or at NPS Scotland Championships at Scone Palace. A pony may only take the qualification for the Silver Medal Final once in a season. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championships to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show on 4th-6th August 2026.

Q3. BSPS Thor Atkinson Steel Fabrications Ltd Challenge. Open Lead Rein, First Ridden Show Pony, SHP, WHP, Cradle & Nursery Stakes, Int SRT, SH, WH and Heritage M&M Lead Rein, First Ridden and WHP. This show is a qualifier for the BSPS Challenge. Animals must qualify for the Challenge by attending any BSPS affiliated Show and competing in the appropriate class. Ponies must NOT have qualified for the 2026 Horse of the Year Show in the appropriate class.

Q4. This Show is a qualifier for the **BSPS Anthony Evans Insurance Champion of Champions.** 1st prize winners in the following classes, Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Lead Rein of Hunter type, Show Pony, SHP, WHP, Intermediate SH, SRT, WH, Heritage Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP.

Q5. This Show is a qualifier for the **BSPS Anthony Evans Insurance Champion of Champions.** 1st prize winners in open cradle and nursery stakes will qualify.

Q6. This Show is affiliated to **EQUIFEST**, taking place at the Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on 5th-8th August 2026. The two highest placed exhibits, not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify.

Q7. This Show is affiliated to the **Dodson & Horrell Equine Sports UK Championships(ESUK)**, taking place at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 30th July – 1st August 2026. The three highest placed exhibits will qualify in each class.

Q8. This Show is a qualifier for LONDON INTERNATIONAL SHOWING SERIES supported by HORSE & HOUND to be held 17th- 21st December 2026.

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 148cm. Plaited ponies. Riders not to have attained their 17th birthday on 1st January in the current year.

Riders of Lead Rein Show Ponies are not to have attained their 8th birthday. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle, the lead rein to be attached by the noseband only. A first rosette will be given to the highest placed Show Pony.

Q14c The two highest placed exhibits in Class 24, not already qualified, will qualify for the Equifest Show Hunter Pony Lead Rein Championship.

CLASS 25 - OPEN FIRST PONY OF HUNTER TYPE / FIRST RIDDEN SHOW PONY

Mare or gelding, 4 yrs. old or over, not exceeding 123cm (12.1 hh). Riders not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st January in the current year. 1st Rosette to the highest placed Show Pony.

TROPHY: The T6 Mini Championship. **The Springthorpe Challenge Trophy** kindly donated by the late Miss Helen Springthorpe. The first and second prize winners from Classes 24 and 25 are eligible to compete for the championship. The Champion and Reserve Champion Mini Show Hunter/ Show Pony will qualify for the Supreme Ridden Pony Championship.

Junior competitors must have attained their 5th birthday and be under 18 on 1st January of the current year and **MUST** wear a correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hat that meets one of the following current Safety Standards in all classes affiliated to or run by the SSA: All PAS 015; VG1; (BS)EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2-17, AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. Adult members, must be 18 or over on 1st January of the current year and **MUST** wear a correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hat that meets one of the following current Safety Standards in all classes: All PAS 015; VG1; (BS)EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2-17, AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards

Safety Hats are required to be worn at all times.

CLASS 99 – SIDE SADDLE CONCOURS d'ELEGANCE

The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance but detailed inspection of rider or tack is not required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the Judge may ask groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. CLASS 102 – THE SIDE SADDLE ASSOCIATION CLASSICAL LADIES SIDE SADDLE QUALIFIER

Open to SSA Adult Members and Non-members, aged 18 and over on January 1st of the current year, riding saddle, on horses exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). To be judged 25% conformation and action, 25% manners and way of going, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider. Judges may request a short show, but exhibits; but horses will not be stripped. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted. **Judges must use the mark sheet provided.** The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, the Qualification Card may be passed down to fourth place. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. One special rosette and the qualification card will be given to the qualifying combination adult each show, this may not always be the winner. If the winner has already qualified they may be passed down to fourth place. **Qualifiers kindly sponsored by Mrs. T. Mitchell and Mr. L. Mitchell.** Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to compete at the Final. The Highest Placed Veteran also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Open In-Hand Veteran Show final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd 2026

CLASS 78 - TATTERSALLS RoR AMATEUR RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2027.

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an **Amateur**. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final. Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting, June 2027

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st–4th + RoR Tattersalls official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships in August 22nd 2026. Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same date – August 22nd 2026

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as a brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage(d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2025. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

QUALIFIERS: Q45A Classes 77 & 78 are qualifiers for the RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Final and the RoR Open In-Hand Show Series Final.

CHAMPIONSHIP: The 1st & 2nd prize winners from Classes 77,78, & 114 are eligible to compete for the Show Champion and Reserve Champion Retrained Racehorse.

TROPHY – Jenny Bourne Memorial Shield – The winners from Classes 77, 78 & 114 are eligible to compete for the championship.

Owners of Pure Bred Irish Draughts and Irish Draught Sport Horse (Part Bred) must be full members of the IDHS (GB) to compete

Irish Draught Part Breds (Sport Horse) are horses that have a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding

Ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over.

In hand breeding classes:-MARES with foals at foot, 3 years and over must be inspected and classified as Class 1 (or RID), Class 2 or Supplementary Grade Up (or AID)

Pure Bred youngstock must be the progeny of an inspected Mare (Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.

Pure Bred ID and ID Part Bred (Sport Horse), 3 year old colts must be un-inspected

All 1, 2 & 3 year old colts must be bitted and shown by an experienced handler over 18 years of age

All Pure-Bred Irish Draught Stallions must be inspected and over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and be Class 1, 2 or RID (GB).

Stallions must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails and be shown by an experienced rider/handler over 18 years of age

GENERAL QUALIFIER INFORMATION:

The Finals of all IDHS (GB) qualifiers will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 5th & 6th September 2026 at Pickering Grange Equestrian, Pickering Grange Farm, Ellistown, Terrance Road, Coalville, LE67 1EZ.

All owners of qualified horses will be contacted by a member of the IDHS (GB) Show Affiliation Team

Horses can only qualify for a specific Final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered.

This show is a qualifier for the £2,000 Ridden Challenge jointly sponsored by the IDHS (GB) and Yorkshire Irish Draught & Hunter Show. The highest placed Pure Bred and Part Bred (not already qualified) from classes 65 & 66 will qualify for the final.

Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. All entries must have current RoR Competition Registered. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree, August 22nd 2026

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st–4th plus RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

The Highest Placed Veteran also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Ridden Veteran Show final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd 2026

The Judge will NOT ride. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge. **Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.** All those entering and/or participating in RoR classes agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. The class to be judged **50%** jumping, **20%** Style while jumping and performance and **30%** awarded for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

PHASE 1

Jumping to be judged:

8 rustic jumps 70cm to 80cm with a maximum spread of 75cm.

The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

10 points to be deducted for a knock down, 15 points to be deducted for a refusal, 20 points for second refusal. Elimination for third refusal or fall or Error of Course.

PHASE 2

Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. *(In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class)*

Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes. Show to include the following movements: walk, trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on long rein. Total marks out of **30%** for Show, manners and suitability to be retrained. Fences for the final at Aintree can be up to a maximum of 85cm with a spread of 80cm.

CHAMPIONSHIP: The 1st & 2nd prize winners from Classes 77,78 and 114 are eligible to compete for the Champion & Reserve Champion Retrained Racehorse.

TROPHY – Jenny Bourne Memorial Shield – The winners from Classes 77, 78 & 114 are eligible to compete for the championship

WORKING HUNTER PONIES

These classes are open to members and non-members of BSPS.

Competitors must declare at the Working Hunter Ring.

WHIPS – Riders must only use a Baton Whip

BODY PROTECTORS: All competitors must wear (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue) shown on the label. Air Jackets may be worn. If a competitor chooses to wear an air jacket they are allowed in addition to a normal body protector, which meets BETA 2018 level 3 standard. Air jackets must not be worn under any jacket or body protector and numbers must be fitted with elasticated fastenings. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every 3-5 years after which the absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Any horse or pony already pre-entered before the closing date may enter any WHP Classes they are eligible for, on the day of the Show - at the Horse Field Marquee. Cash entries only and these entries will carry a surcharge of £5.

CLASS 115 – 60cm WORKER STAKES

Plaited or Heritage Mountain and Moorland Ponies 4yrs old and over not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age, but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. **An Award Card for the highest placed child under 12yrs of age on 1st January in the current year.**

CLASS 118 -90cm WORKER STAKES

Plaited or Heritage Mountain and Moorland ponies, 4 years old and over not exceeding 158cm Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony / horse they ride. **An Award Card for the highest placed child under 18yrs of age on 1st January in the current year.**

The Leader must be 16 years old or over and may only lead one pony in a class.

The rein **MUST** go directly from the bit to the rider's hand, with no extra aids or attachments to or on the saddle.

Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle. The Lead Rein must be affixed to the noseband on which it must remain while the pony is in the ring.

Whilst in the ring ponies must always be led by the leader.

The Leader must lead on the near side with the lead rein in the left hand.

RIDERS - Hats in accordance with BSPS Rules, Tweed Jackets, Beige or cream jodhpurs, Shirt, tie, boots and gloves.

Body protectors are compulsory in this class.

No Buttonholes

Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course at the judge's discretion.

A stride or two of canter over the fences will not be penalised.
